Reading and Approval of October Minutes

Treasurer's Report:

Programming:

There will be a small fee for this workshop, and we are able to offer scholarships for the workshop as well. There was a suggestion of a Trunk Show by our African American quilters for our February meeting. Board members agreed to reach out to our members and the St. Johns Quilters to find people who will agree to share their work.

Membership:

Mary reported that we had two new members join our Guild this month. We now have 177 active members. Farah suggested promoting our Guild through social media to increase membership.

New Business:

Raffle Quilt:

Margaret expressed the need for a new raffle quilt. There is a quilt that has been started by Kirsten Fisher and others that had been intended as a second quilt for our canceled show. We agreed to inquire whether this quilt is still available as a raffle quilt for our next show. We also agreed to keep our eyes out for designs that would allow for participation by more members in the making of the quilt.
