

2010 QUILT SHOW REGISTRATION

It's time to pull out all the quilts you've made since the last quilt show and decide which of your beauties you want to have displayed at our 2010 show, Around the Block Again!

Registration forms will be included in the December Bee, as well as being e-mailed to everyone on our distribution list. Here's what you need to know to successfully register your quilt:

- 1. You can register up to two quilts; only one is guaranteed for display:** Since we're at a much smaller venue, we'll have to limit the number of entries per member. You MAY submit a registration form for two quilts, but we will ask you to prioritize them as to which you would MOST prefer be shown. Your second entries will be considered, based on the number of entries received and space available.
- 2. Measure. Measure. Measure:** Measure your quilts at least THREE times to make sure you are sending us the correct quilt measurements. Size matters! We can not accept any quilts LARGER than 103" by 103".
- 3. Fill in all the blanks:** Review your registration form to make sure you haven't left anything out!
- 4. Send a picture:** Take a Polaroid or digital print - it doesn't have to be anything fancy - but we need to be able to SEE what it looks like! Submit it with your registration form. Please put your name and name of quilt on your photo so we know who it belongs to in case it gets separated from the registration form!
- 5. Send in your registration form(s):** You may email forms and digital pictures to raengelman@gmail.com or mail hard copies to Robin Engelman, 223 Bay Ridge Avenue, Brooklyn, NY 11220. The deadline for ALL quilt entries is Saturday, February 20, 2010.
- 6. Sign up to volunteer:** We depend on you to make it a great show. Every member who submits a quilt is required to give up four hours of their time in support of the show: before, during and/or after! We won't show your quilt if you haven't signed up for a shift!

We will begin to accept quilt registrations at this December's meeting. Photos MUST be attached to the registration forms. You can submit registrations for works-in-progress only if you know the final size of the quilt and feel CERTAIN it will be completed by show time!

We've seen some beautiful quilts at Show-and-Tell over the last two years, and we can't wait to see them on display next April. Happy quilting!
